### **Luke's School of Prayer**

Each Gospel author had to choose which of the words and deeds of Jesus to include and which to omit. When Luke made his selection, he chose to include more material on prayer than is found in the other Gospels. This indicates that instructing his readers about prayer was one of Luke's purposes in writing his Gospel.

Luke above all teaches about prayer through his portrayal of Jesus at prayer. Luke presents Jesus at prayer nine times in the course of his Gospel. By comparison, Mark presents Jesus praying five times; Matthew and John each three times. By choosing to include more incidents of Jesus at prayer, Luke holds up the prayerful Jesus as an example for his readers. Jesus' life during his public ministry was akin to the life of a political candidate right before an election: on the move, constantly with others, always in the limelight. **"A large number of people from all of Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon came to hear him and to be healed of their diseases. Everyone in the crowd sought to touch him" (6:17-19).** Jesus' mission determined his lifestyle, but his lifestyle made it difficult for him to find time for prayer. Jesus prayed anyway: **"Great crowds assembled to listen to him and be cured of their ailments, but he would withdraw to deserted places to pray" (5:15-16).**

Many of us have hectic lives and find it difficult to spend regular time in prayer. Jesus led a life that was even more hectic than ours. He was far more besieged by people in need than we are besieged, but he made time to pray. We should do the same.

Jesus spent time in prayer particularly at the critical points in his life, when a decision had to be made or reaffirmed. Luke passes rather quickly over Jesus' baptism by John to tell us that while Jesus was praying afterwards, the Holy Spirit descended upon him and a voice from heaven said to him, **"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (3:21-22).** This was a turning point for Jesus. It was apparently while he was at prayer that it became clear to Jesus that now was the moment for him to go forth as the Son of God, empowered by the Holy Spirit to establish the reign of God.

When Jesus came to choose some of his disciples for a special role, **"he departed to the mountain to pray and he spent the night in prayer" (6:12).** At daybreak he chose twelve to be apostles (6:13). Much would rest on the Twelve and Jesus selected them after praying about whom he should choose. We should likewise turn to God to seek his will for us, particularly when we are faced with important decisions or are at a turning point in our lives.

All else that Luke's Gospel teaches about prayer can be read as a commentary on the prayer life of Jesus. Jesus is the teacher and model in Luke's school of prayer.

**CANADIAN FOODGRAINS BANK**

CANADIAN FOODGRAINS BANK (CFB)  
COMMUNITY HARVEST GROWING PROJECT (CHGP)

This past year our local CHGP grew 10 acres of corn, produced a yield of 130 bushels per acre and raised \$4382.22. The combination of crop sales, support from our sponsors and generous donations from individuals allowed us to send \$16000.00 to the CFB. Every dollar worth of funding, grain or other aid committed by the CFB is matched 4:1 by CIDA, to a maximum of \$25 million per year. Across Canada last year the CFB raised \$10.5 million. As a result, \$23.7 was committed for food assistance, \$10.1 million for food security and \$2.2 million for nutrition programming in needy parts of the world. Thank you **very** much for your generous support in past years. Our parish will be supporting the CFB again this year. A presentation will be made in Goderich on **July 31/August 1** and in Clinton on **September 4**. *Special collection envelopes will be found in the bulletin on the specified dates at the specified sites.*

**HEALTH MATTERS**



*Salmonella* are a group of bacteria that normally live in the intestinal tracts of animals and birds. The bacteria are usually transmitted to people when they eat foods contaminated with animal feces. Contaminated foods are

often of animal origin, such as beef, poultry, milk or eggs. But all foods, including fruits and vegetables, can become contaminated. *Sources of Salmonella...*Contaminated foods, such as raw meat, poultry and eggs that have not been cooked properly, are the most common source of the disease. Not washing fresh fruits and vegetables before eating them, as well as not thoroughly cleaning work surfaces used to prepare raw meat and other foods in the kitchen can also expose you to Salmonella. Food can also be contaminated by food handlers who do not thoroughly wash their hands with soap after handling raw meat or after using the bathroom. Salmonella can be found in the feces of some pets, especially those with diarrhea. Exotic pets, such as snakes, turtles and reptiles, may carry Salmonella even when healthy. People can become infected if they do not wash their hands after contact.

## **HEALTH MATTERS**



*Minimizing Your Risk of Salmonellosis...* 1. Contaminated foods may look and smell normal. Thoroughly cook foods to destroy the bacteria. 2. Do not eat raw or undercooked eggs, poultry or meat. Remember raw eggs are contained in foods such as homemade hollandaise sauce, caesar and other salad dressings, tiramisu, homemade ice cream, homemade mayonnaise, cookie dough and frostings. 3. Poultry and meat, including hamburgers, should be well-cooked, not pink in the middle. If you are served undercooked food in a restaurant, send it back. 4. Avoid raw or unpasteurized milk and other dairy products. Mother's milk is the safest food for infants. Breast feeding prevents salmonellosis and many other health problems. 5. Thoroughly wash fruits and vegetables before eating them. 6. When buying and storing groceries, keep meats separate from fruits, vegetables, cooked foods and ready-to-eat foods. 7. Because bacteria grow quickly at room temperature, go directly home from grocery shopping and refrigerate or freeze food immediately. 8. Always defrost food in the refrigerator, in cold water or in the microwave, never at room temperature. Set your refrigerator to 4 degrees C (40 degrees F) and your freezer to -18 degrees C (0 F). 9. Wash your hands before handling any food. Be sure to wash your hands, cutting boards, counters, knives and other utensils after preparing uncooked foods. 10. If you have been diagnosed with salmonellosis, do not prepare food or pour water for anyone else until you are clear of the bacteria. 11. Wash your hands after contact with animal feces, for example, after changing the kitty litter or scooping up after your dog. 12. Since reptiles can have Salmonella, always wash your hands after handling them. Reptiles, including turtles, are not appropriate pets for children and should not be in the same house as an infant. 13. If you are diagnosed with salmonellosis, be sure that you or your doctor informs the local Public Health Department. If many cases occur at the same time, it may mean that a restaurant or a particular food item has a problem that needs to be corrected.
