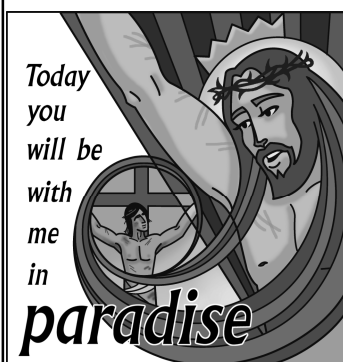

"YES" TO THE KING

The Church crowns the year of grace, its liturgical year, with the solemnity of Christ the King. We could assume that a celebration of this magnitude would provide us with an easy, clear presentation of who Christ is and who he calls us to be. But this feast flings the paradoxes of Christ's kingship in our face. Is Christ all-powerful? Is he the Messiah, the Anointed of God? Is he a victim, powerless in the hands of mortal rulers? Is he dead on the cross? Is he alive in the splendor of eternal light? Is the inscription above his head true? Is he Shepherd or slaughtered lamb? The answer is "Yes." What may be even more difficult is that we have also answered "Yes" to following this complex, paradoxical King who reigns from the cross of death, who upsets our expectations and challenges us to upset many of the expectations of the world around us. But before we despair of being able to sustain the difficulty of this mission, we are also strengthened by Paul's words to the Colossians. We are reminded that if we keep our eyes fixed on the cross, the throne of Christ, we will also find and know the source of our reconciliation, our peace, and our hope to join him, sharing the inheritance of the holy ones in light everlasting.

ST. MARTIN DE PORRES: SOCIAL JUSTICE

BOTTLED WATER FACTS: It requires 3 times as much water to make the bottle as it does to fill it...it is an exceptionally wasteful industry. Imagine a water bottle filled a quarter of the way up with oil. That's about how much oil was needed to produce and transport the bottle. 25% of bottled water sold in Canada comes directly from a public tap before being processed. A litre of bottled water can cost up to 2,000 times more than a litre of tap water. The public water in a major Canadian city might be tested over 120,000 a year. By contrast, bottled water is often not tested at all. The majority of plastic bottles are not recycled. They end up in landfills and, as they decompose, pollute the soil and water. WHY GIVE UP USING BOTTLED WATER?



Bottled water represents the privatization of water, where water becomes viewed as a manufactured good rather than an essential need that must be publicly-accessible. In Canada, where we are fortunate enough to have access to clean drinking water, we should not have to use water bottles, which create a vast amount of waste and transform water into a consumer product. By choosing tap water over bottled water when available, Canadians can make a gesture of solidarity with people in the Global South who are seeing their water sources being placed in the hands of private interests, who then sell water at a cost that is unreachable for many. We are also asking public institutions, like schools and parishes to consider eliminating the use of bottled water on their sites.
